As you know, the Act 1 Point of Contact must *create a student-specific individualized Graduation Plan* to ensure on-time graduation. Act 1 permits eligible students who attended school during the 2021-2022 school year but were not afforded a pathway to timely graduation to be graduated during the 2022-2023 school year *without attending school or completing additional requirements*. In such cases, a student's diploma should be retroactively dated to the 2021-2022 school year. Schools are encouraged to exercise flexibility as to how credits are recognized to support students' ability to graduate on time, in accordance with Pennsylvania Department of Education's Act 1 guidance.

In determining a pathway to on-time graduation, the Point of Contact must follow the following process to determine how a student may be able to graduate:

- School Last Attended During the 2021-2022 School Year: The Point of Contact must first determine if a student qualifies to graduate from the school they last attended after considering all full and partial credits earned in prior schools and options for a student to demonstrate proficiency in coursework. If possible, the student should be graduated from this school.
- o **Prior School**: If graduating from the school they last attended is not possible, the Point of Contact can request a diploma from a school the student previously attended if the student meets that school's graduation requirements.
- State-issued Keystone Diploma: As a last resort, if a student cannot graduate from the school
  they last attended or a previous school and the student meets statewide graduation requirements
  under Act 158, the Point of Contact should support the student in applying for a state-issued
  Keystone Diploma.
