

Request to Opt Out of Disclosing “Directory Information” (Eligible Students)¹

Dear Principal _____,

I understand that education records are subject to important confidentiality protections under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and generally cannot be disclosed by schools to third parties without written consent.¹ One limited exemption is the disclosure of “directory information,” which may be disclosed by schools without prior written permission, unless consent is revoked.²

Schools are able to designate what “personally identifiable information” is considered to be “directory information.”³ By law, directory information may include, but is not limited to, any or all of the following information:⁴

- ☐ Participation in officially
recognized activities and sports

Schools must provide at least an annual public notice to current eligible students and parent(s) of current students in a language they understand⁵ about what information is considered to be “directory information” and advise families of the deadline to opt out of the disclosure of this information.⁶ The school’s opt-out deadline must also be “reasonable.”⁷

As you know, current eligible students⁸ and the parent(s)⁹ of current students have the right to opt out of the disclosure of directory information by submitting a timely written request.¹⁰ **An “eligible student,” under FERPA, is a student who has reached 18 years of age or is attending an institution of postsecondary education.**¹¹

¹² The McKinney-Vento Act defines students who lack a "fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence," as experiencing homelessness. See 42 U.S.C § 11434a(2)(A). Homelessness is expansively defined and includes, but is not limited to, students, who are: "living doubled-up" with friends or family due to economic hardship or loss of housing; "couch-surfing;" living in temporary or emergency shelters; living on campgrounds (including those who are unsheltered, in a tent, recreational camper, or other inadequate accommodations), living in a car, hotel, or trailer park; living in a place that is not ordinarily used for sleeping; living unsheltered; or living in housing that is legally recognized as substandard.
